

Share a story about a favorite teacher, school event, or other school memory

Cindy Herr: Favorite teachers: Ms. Olsen, Mrs. Bentley, Mrs. Buerkle

Kay Keskinen: From my perspective, the Mills school district provided a quality education. A major factor in my education was Mrs. Angeline Buerkle, one of my teachers who also taught my father. Mrs. Buerkle and I stayed in contact after I graduated, and she often mentioned that she "taught me everything from PE to physics." She was a terrific role model who knew how to academically challenge students. I especially remember my senior year when I took trigonometry from her. The class was not difficult for me, so not only did Mrs. Buerkle allow me to jump ahead in the class, she also gave me a college calculus textbook and taught me trig and calc during the class. Few women were math and science teachers in those days; she made it acceptable for me to study math and physics in college.

Kathy (Maijala) Erickson: Mrs. Marquardt, 1st grade (I still have a letter she wrote me.) Ruby Olsen (because she pushed us to do our best and believed in us)

Kathy (Pesola) Wellmann: My favorite teacher was Mrs. Bauer.

Sue (Tumberg) Wallace: One of the most memorable moments was when I was called into the principal's office (Larson?) when I was either a Junior or Senior because my pants were too tight! I remember they were royal blue, much like the ones they wear today. I still hate baggy pants.

Ron Virnala: Most children have their first 'love' in grade school. I had one in third grade. No, I am not going to tell her name because that is not is not important.

It was sixth grade where I met my best friend who is still my best friend through these years. His name, Gary Wanderi. We met each other in our second year in sixth grade. I tell people that they liked each of us so much that they kept us for two years. Gary and I have hunted deer together. We have shared our lives together through good times and hard. When the time comes that God calls one of us home, it really is going to be hard to bear.

I also remember the sixth grade teacher, Mrs. Holland. She was a beautiful lady. I remember that she always had us say a prayer before going to eat lunch. I also remember saying the Pledge of Allegiance every morning.

Do you remember Miss Olsen's class in high school? I caused her two awkward moments. One was in the spring of the year. I was looking outside at the trees and thinking about the farm that I grew up on. She asked me what it was that she was talking about and I told her word for word what it was. She was a little upset. Another time was when I had closed my eyes for about a minute or two. She asked me for the answer to her question. I answered the question, again it upset her. She said something like, "Mr. Virnala, I do not know how you can do that with your eyes closed!" I do not think I was one of her favorite students.

Editor's note: Miss Olsen retired in 1972 after 44 years of teaching, the last 18 years were in the Mills school. In March of 1972 Miss Olsen married Ownie W. Sifritson. He passed away in 1975, and she passed away in 1991 at the age of 80.

In 1991 the Ruby Olsen-Sifritson Scholarship was created to assist New York Mills students attending post secondary training. Each year at least two students receive funds from the scholarship.
